

#### **Coaches Portal**

- Primary hub for all resources related to NYHL
- Contains important forms, documents and resources
- All forms are available for online submission straight from our website (Tiering, Game Sheet Submission, All Star Ballots)
- Rules and Resources Rulebook, Key Dates, Tournament Entry Deadlines etc.





### **League Fees for 2025-26**

#### **Team Registration Fees**

- U7 U15 \$1600.00
- U16 U21 \$1900.00

#### **Player Registration Fees**

- \$445.00 per regular rostered player
- \$295.00 per sibling on the same team
- Paid in 3 installments due October 31<sup>st</sup>, December 1<sup>st</sup>, January 30<sup>th</sup> through your club
- Teams are charged per player starting at their age group's Minimum Roster Size and up to the Maximum Bench Strength

## **Affiliated Players**

• A "chain affiliate" is a club team of the same name.

#### U7 to U10

- A player may be brought up from a chain affiliate in a lower tier
- From the house league of the same division

#### U11 to U13

- From a chain affiliate in a lower tier
- From a chain affiliate from ONE YEAR below
- From the house league of the same division

#### U14 to U21

- From a chain affiliate in a lower tier
- From a chain affiliate up to TWO YEARS below
- From the house league of the same division



#### **AP Restrictions**

#### AP Restrictions <u>BEFORE</u> Jan 15<sup>th</sup>

- An AP player can be called up regardless of minimum bench strength before Jan 15<sup>th</sup>
- AP players cannot be added if the team will exceed the maximum bench strength

#### AP Restrictions STARTING Jan 15<sup>th</sup>

- Chain Affiliate = 5 games only 2 of which can be in the playoffs
- House League = 5 games PLUS 2 in the playoffs
- A team may only call up an AP if they are below their minimum bench strength and may only call up enough to reach the <a href="mailto:appropriate">appropriate</a> minimum bench strength
- Teams may use a maximum of five (5) AP's in any one game
- Affiliated Players MUST be added to the EGS as an AP or AG



# Min / Max Bench Strength

#### Minimum Bench Strength

- U7 to U9 13 players
  - If a team has 12 or less players available, an AP player can be called up
- U10 to U21 15 players
  - If a team has 14 or less players available, an AP player can be called up
- Goalies are included in the minimum bench count
  - Exceptions can be made if the team is at minimum bench strength but does not have a goalie

#### Maximum Bench Strength

- U7-U9 16 skaters + 2 goalies
- U10-U21 18 skaters + 2 goalies
- For a game to start, a team must ice a minimum of 6 skaters or 5 skaters and 1 goalie.

### **Marlies Jamboree**


- Saturday, February 28

## **AGILEX AND EGS SYSTEM**



#### **Season Structure**

- FALL SEASON 10 GAMES
  - Begins October 6.
- WINTER SEASON 8 GAMES
  - Begins December 15.
    - Some teams may begin the Winter Season earlier.
- PLAYOFFS 3 GAMES MINIMUM
  - Expected to begin the week of February 16.
    - Some teams may begin the Playoffs earlier.
  - Playoff structures are tier dependent and released in January.



# **Scheduling**

- Operates on a 3-week rolling schedule .
  - Accommodates the 5-week deadline for tournament entry or exemption days.
  - Playoffs may have 24 hours notice prior to game time.
- Each scheduled week begins Monday Sunday.
- No Games
  - Thanksgiving October 11 13
  - Winter Break December 24 January 2
  - Family Day February 16
  - March Break March 16 22
  - Easter Weekend April 3 6



# Limiting Factors to the League Schedule

- 1. Blackout Days
- 2. Arena and Ice Allocation
- 3. Tournament and Exemption Days
- 4. Tiering



# **Blackout Days**

- Submitted with Team Registration.
- Each team is offered two (2) weekly blackout days from the league schedule.
- This is to accommodate House Leagues and Practice nights.
- Teams will not be scheduled to play on their blackout days.
- Friday and Saturday are 50% of league blackout days.

### **Tiering**

- System is to best match team skill levels to maintain a standard of competition.
- Teams will only play against other teams within their designated Tier.
- Decided by the NYHL Tiering Committee.

#### FALL TIERING

Tiering Forms were submitted by September 17.

#### WINTER TIERING

- Teams are re-tiered for the Winter Season.
- Tiering Forms to be submitted by November 22.
- Tiering Committee will meet November 24.
- Clubs will respond to tiering proposal by November 26.
- Final tiers will be published with the schedule on or before December 1.

### **Tournaments and Exemption Days**

#### Tournament Entry

- 1 Preseason Tournament Prior to October 6<sup>th</sup>
- 3 In-Season Tournaments Fall and Winter Season
- 1 Post-Season Tournament February 23<sup>rd</sup> or later
- Teams may enter a tournament during Thanksgiving, Winter Break, March Break or Easter Weekend and will not count toward the above limit.
- Tournaments remove a team from the schedule for 3 days (Friday-Sunday).
- Game sheets must be submitted 48 hours upon completion of the event through the Coaches Portal.

#### Exemption Days

- Teams are allowed 2 Exemption Days to be removed from the schedule.
  - Used for tournament travel/team events etc.
- In addition, teams are allowed **2 Religious Exemption days** in the final week of the Winter Season and Playoffs.
  - Must be on the Interfaith Calendar which can be found in the Coaches Portal under Rules and Resources.
- Applications tournament or exemption days must be submitted to the office
   5 weeks in advance of the event by your Club Contact.

# How do These Factors Impact the Schedule?

• The distribution of teams in your tier, your opponents chosen blackout days, your chosen blackout days, work to limit weekly availability, which limits the available arenas to be scheduled.

#### • Example:

- Warren Park is in a Tier of 5 teams. Warren Park has blackout days as Monday and Thursday. The 4 other teams in their tier have Friday as their blackout day.
  - Warren Park will not play at Lambton Arena or any arena the league has available on Friday.
- Forest Hill is in a Tier of 6. They have their blackout days as Friday and Saturday. 3 teams have Monday as their blackout day.
  - Forest Hill will only be able to be scheduled on Monday night against two opponents in their tier.

### **Exhibition Games**

- Exhibition games must be submitted for approval to the league office by your Club Contact.
- Both NYHL teams must submit for approval.
- An exhibition game <u>CANNOT</u> be played without league approval.
- The league will not schedule around exhibition games unless an exemption day used.
- Exhibition games sheets must be submitted to the league office within 48 hours (5:00 PM deadline).
- Game sheets MUST be legible and filled out properly.

#### **Start Of Game Procedure**

- Prior to entering dressing room, notify Rink Attendant of any issues with the dressing room.
- A game may start up to 15 minutes before the scheduled start time if BOTH teams and officials are ready and BOTH teams agree.
- 3 minute warm-up
- 0:45 left whistle
- Team least ready at end of 3 warm up minor penalty
   Delay of Game



### **Game Length**

- **U7 U9:** 18 X 18 (stop time)
  - Last 10 minutes of period 2 will be run time during a 5-goal spread.
  - U9 before November 1.
- **U9 U14:** 12 12 12
  - U9 starting November 1
- **U15 U21:** 12-12-15
- Flood will be after every game except for U7 U9 due to boards.
- Game times will remain the same for playoffs.
- 5 goal spread rule
  - Running time in the 3<sup>rd</sup> period until deficit is dropped to 3.
- Timeouts One per team will be allowed in the Semi Final and Final ONLY



#### **End Of Game Procedure**

- Referee to direct Coach to hold bench.
- One team exits at a time.
- Dressing room door must be open (GM99 to the Coach).
- Game sheet will be uploaded by the end of the night and available by the next morning.
  - Please notify your Club Contact if the game sheet is not available and the office will correct.



## **Injured Players**

- If play is stopped due to an injured player, the injured player must sit out for one stoppage of play.
- If player leaves the game and does not return due to injury, a HC report must be submitted within 48 hours.
   This can be found on our Coaches Portal.
- If visiting a practitioner due to injury, must have a note to return to play.



### Suspensions

- Club Contacts will receive an email notifying of the suspended player.
- Any player with a GM, Gross Misconduct or Match Penalty must sit out until the NYHL office advises the Club Contact of the suspension length.
- Suspensions are to be served in League or Tournament play and CANNOT be served during Exhibition Games.
- There are no Appeals for suspensions fewer than 6 games.



## **No Show Policy**

- 10 minutes on clock.
- After 10 minutes, 40-minute run time for team that is present to practice.
- Absent team forfeits and is fined.



# **Default in Playoffs**

- Incurs a serious fine and expulsion from playoffs.
- We emphasize exhausting every AP option.
- If you are unable to ice a sufficient number of players, we ask that you withdraw the team rather than to disrupt the schedule.



#### **Procedure for Protests**

- Protests regarding games played must be made in writing via email to the League Office by your Club Contact. Such protests must include a summary of any evidence to be submitted to support the protest. A copy of the protest will be forwarded to the other club by the League Office.
- Must be delivered by the protesting Club to the NYHL
   Office within 48 hours of the incident under protest.
- The protest fee of \$300.00 will be invoiced if the protest is withdrawn or the outcome is not in the protesting team's favour.



### **Protesting an Ineligible Player**

- Teams wishing to protest ineligible players must notify the Referee <u>prior</u> to the conclusion of the game.
- Alleged ineligible players are to have their name, team name and number printed on paper supplied by the Timekeeper.
- The requested players will then <u>sign their names and date of birth</u> beside the printed name.
- Teams may request the signatures of a maximum of two (2) opposing players.
- A formal protest must still be presented to the League Office.
- It is the bench staff's responsibility to ensure their lineup on the game sheet is accurate.
- Bench staff are encouraged to verify their lineup with the Timekeeper prior to the start of the game.



# Cross Ice (U7) & Modified Ice (U8/U9)

- U7 plays 4 on 4
- U8/U9 play 5 on 5
- 18 x 18 (stop-time)
  - 5 goal spread last 10 minutes run time
- Home team will start at opposite end to allow equal bench advantage.
- Face-offs and stoppages of play will occur as per usual game to allow for line changes etc.



### **Board Set Up**

- Bench Staff are responsible for setting up the boards.
- A member from each team's bench staff MUST aid timekeepers and officials with setting up AND taking down boards.
- Boards may have to be moved for possible floods.
- Boards must be set up before the first game and taken down after last game.
- Boards MUST be taken off the ice and stored correctly.
- Safety equipment is available at all arenas with Boards.
- Teams may be fined for non-compliance.
